


Church Mission Project

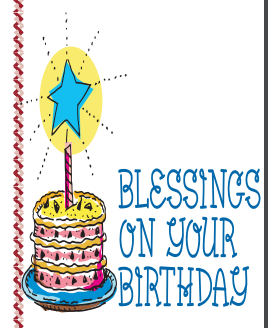

That They May Know

When we lived in Alabama we had these awful little creatures called armadillos invade our backyard. We spent a great deal of time working on our yard, and we were very pleased with the way things looked. But then the armadillos came and in a matter of days they destroyed our yard, leaving large holes everywhere.

I came to find out that the armadillos were not partying in our yard because it looked so good; they were there because of what I did not see, something that was under the surface. They were after the grubs and insects in our lawn. To my eye, I had a healthy, beautiful lawn. Yet right under the surface was an unhealthy problem that was hidden from sight. And it was that problem that led to the destruction of our yard.

As our children progress through the normal stages of growth and development we should strive to see those unhealthy character problems that are under the surface. They are not visible to everyone, but they are there and we will see them. We can take what seems like the easy way out and choose to ignore them, hoping they will go away on their own. That usually does not work and they very rarely go away on their own. Usually they will magnify and others will feast on those hidden problems. It is our role to help our children identify the problems and deal with them in a biblical manner. The goal is to use the truth of God’s word to address the issues and seek God’s help in replacing these problem areas with God honoring attributes.

I won’t get into how we solved our armadillo problem. But I will say this, I never knew a small, clumsy animal could jump so high.
