A Note from Pastor Trevor

3,000 more people believed in Jesus. The early church was exploding! As we continue in the book of Acts, we see that the immediate outworking of these Spirit-filled believers was their devotion to the teaching of Jesus and the showing of hospitality to others.

> "And they were selling their possessions and belongings and distributing the proceeds to all, as any had need. And day by day, attending the temple together and breaking bread in their homes, they received their food with glad and generous hearts, praising God and having favor with all the people. And the Lord added to their number day by day those who were being saved." - Acts 2:45-47

Hospitality is defined as "the friendly and generous reception and entertainment of guests, visitors, or strangers." To invite someone into your home or your church and welcome them to participate in spending

time and sharing a meal is an incredible and meaningful act of showing love. The showing of hospitality is also a fundamental aspect of the Christian life. We see the example of Jesus showing hospitality as he regularly shared meals with others, particularly with others looked down on by society.

The Bible commands us to show hospitality. Hebrews 13:1-2 says, "Let brotherly love continue. Do not neglect to show hospitality to strangers, for thereby some have entertained angels unawares." The author of Hebrews assumes that the church is already showing hospitality as he calls the church to "continue" in it. We offer hospitality as an act of genuine love for others, flowing out of how God has shown his great love to us. As God has welcomed us into his family through Christ, we, too, welcome others into our homes and churches to share the love of Christ. Through this, believers will be encouraged and strengthened in their faith, and non-believers may warm to the gospel and be more open to conversations through our hospitality.

In recent weeks at Hurstbourne Baptist Church, we have sought to expand our greeter ministry to be even more intentional in giving a warm welcome and showing hospitality to all who enter our

church building on Sunday mornings. Our prayer is that our guests will know from the moment they enter the walls of our church that we are glad they have come and that we love them with the love of Christ. Jesus says, "By this all people will know that you are my disciples, if you have love for one another" (John 13:35). A proof of our faith and love for Christ is how we show love to others.

We have excellent opportunities to show hospitality as we approach the Christmas season. As you plan holiday gatherings and events, consider inviting a neighbor, coworker, or friend into your home or to a restaurant for a meal. Or perhaps you could ask someone to go see Christmas lights with you! Inviting someone to church during the Christmas season is a great way to show hospitality. What better way to encourage people and share the gospel than to bring them to a worship service where we will sing of Jesus and hear God's Word preached? You could even invite them to a meal afterward and discuss what stood out from God's Word that morning.

On December 9th and 10th, we will have our Christmas concert, "No Other Name," where we will celebrate the birth of Jesus and declare that "there is no other name under heaven given among men by which we must be saved" (Acts 4:12). This will be an excellent opportunity to celebrate Christmas as a church family, but also to invite others to celebrate Jesus with us and to find hope in the gospel.

I encourage you to find ways to show hospitality this Christmas season and throughout the whole year. It isn't always possible to host big parties and meals for people all the time, depending on the season of your life. Still, we can always look for ways to invite others into our lives by giving them our time, sharing what we have, and pointing them to the love and hope of Jesus.
